

Gazebos

Our gazebos will give you years of enjoyment while enhancing the beauty of your property. A screened gazebo will give you a place to escape from the mosquitoes on warm summer evenings. Our gazebos are built by craftsmen who enjoy turning out top quality work. All gazebos have 2x6" floor joists for extra strength. They are assembled with screws to ensure a solid structure that will last for years.

To figure the price of your gazebo, start with the base gazebo price in the size and type you prefer. Then, add the options you want. The base gazebo price is for a complete, pre-assembled gazebo.

Clear Coat or Semi-Transparent Stain (pine only)

With Clear Coat, your gazebo will come sprayed inside and out with a high-quality sealer, either clear or semi-transparent color. This will help protect the wood from the ultraviolet rays which cause it to weather. The sealer will also keep the wood smoother and help protect against checking.

Paint or Solid Color Stain (pine only)

Paint or solid color stain adds a tough, elastic, latex finish. If your gazebo is screened and painted, add for painted screens so the screen frames are painted to match. We also recommend the clear coat roof & floor option (call for price) for our painted gazebos. It provides protection for the unpainted surfaces.

Note: If you want a painted gazebo, the best solution (in our opinion) is the vinyl (maintenance-free) gazebo. This will eliminate problems that come with painted surfaces.

Screens

The Screen option provides high quality screen in removable screens and a quality, self-closing screen door. Most of our customers leave the screens in year round. If you experience problems with mosquitoes, you will appreciate this practical option. We can also put a screen under the floor. Screen frames are either wood or aluminum. We also offer snap-in, flexible screens on vinyl gazebos. These are easily removed and stored for the winter months.

3-Season Windows in Pine Gazebos

We offer 3-season windows as an option for those who want to enjoy their gazebo in the cooler months. These are tough vinyl, vertical-track windows that collapse out of the way (either up or down) in warmer weather. The windows are made to withstand hurricane-force winds. Screens are on the outside of the windows. The window panels can be easily cleaned from the inside of the gazebo without disturbing the screens. These windows can also turn your gazebo into additional storage for the winter months.

(Design Your Own Gazebo)

1. What size?
2. What shape? Octagon, oval or oblong, square or rectangle.
3. What railing style? Classic, deluxe (pine only) or colonial.
4. What roof style? Straight or curved; single or pagoda (double) roof.
5. What type of shingles? Asphalt, cedar shakes, rubber slate, or metal.
6. If you choose asphalt shingles, what type of ceiling? Cedar sheathing is standard for vinyl gazebos. Plywood sheathing is standard on wood gazebos; tongue & groove pine sheathing is optional. (Cedar shake shingles also make the ceiling.)
7. Do you want screens or windows & screens?
8. Do you want wood or maintenance-free vinyl? Wood gazebos can be stained or painted many different colors to help preserve them or to match your home. Vinyl gazebos come in white, ivory & clay.
9. Other considerations: benches, wiring, etc. See "Other Options" listed under the price charts.

3-Season Windows in Vinyl Gazebos

We offer 3-season windows as an option for those who want to enjoy their gazebo in the cooler months. These are glass windows that slide out of the way in warmer weather. Screens are on the outside of the windows. These windows can also turn your gazebo into additional storage for the winter months.

Wiring (pine)

Choose the Wiring option if you plan on installing a light or ceiling fan in your gazebo. A wire is hidden inside a post all the way to the peak of the roof, where a standard 4" box is located. There is also an electrical outlet included at the floor level for other uses.

Wiring (vinyl)

There is only a wire installed for a receptacle, switch and fan. You must add the electrical boxes after the gazebo is installed.

Pagoda (Double Roof)

The Double Roof (pagoda) option adds a second roof for a beautiful Victorian look. It also allows for better ventilation, with its open air space between the two.
